

Interspeak at Barkers Vale

Last week, on Thursday the 20th of September, we held the annual Interspeak Public Speaking competition in the Barkers Vale Hall. This event involved all the COLOURSS (Community of Learners of the Upper Richmond Small Schools) group. That means we had competitors from Afterlee, Barkers Vale, Collins Creek, Rukenvale, The Risk and Wiangaree schools. Contestants were drawn from Stage Two (Years Three and Four) and Stage Three (Years Five and Six). Each stage was offered a choice of seven topics to choose from. Topics included Students need longer holidays: Should boys and girls have separate classrooms? Money can't buy love and happiness; Zoos are worse than human prisons and a variety of others. We were lucky enough to have the support and skills of Leila Gray and Peter Lanyon as Judges for the event. Leila is an English Teacher at Kyogle High School and Peter is the former Principal of Barkers Vale School. The children were required to meet certain criteria as they gave their

speech, such as providing a speech which had a logical sequence, engaging the audience, using eye contact and being creative and original.

As many of you would be aware, speaking in front of an audience is a most challenging experience and most adults would rather avoid it if they can! The children in our competition were amazingly skilled, composed and informative. Comments noted by the judges included Much theatre and drama and expression offered throughout. Clever and convincing with creative ideas was another comment. Brilliant use of dramatic irony and Very engaging speaker... Funny and ethical content were some more comments noted.

As usual it was a difficult job for the judges, as the standard of all these primary school speakers was just amazing! In the end, Barkers Vale students took out all the major prizes with Blossom taking out first and Oscar second in Stage Three and Mallee first and Fergus second in Stage Two. We all felt immensely proud!

On the day we were also ably assisted by Darius, Liz and Anna as hosts and Mathilda and Imagen as fabulous and accurate Timekeepers.

The next step for our speakers is in Term Four at the Lismore City Hall where the contestants move onto the next level, competing against children from the Northern Rivers area. We wish them all the best and will provide dates and times in next term's newsletter.

Marvellous Musicians!

This term our STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) focus has been to create a musical instrument out of recycled materials. To motivate the children, earlier in the term we watched a couple of film clips about a village in Paraguay where the inhabitants earned their living by sorting

through huge piles of garbage. An inspirational part of this story related to the efforts of one man who has spent his time creating beautiful and functional musical instruments for the children in the village. The challenge this term was to use the design process to individually create an instrument that can actually be played. The children could work alongside other children, but each person had to have their own instrument. The children used a number of interesting and innovative materials to create drums, chimes, stringed instruments and various percussion instruments. The students also spent some time reflecting on the process and writing how they built the instrument, overcame problems, how the instrument makes sound and any changes they would make if they did the whole process again.

On Friday 21st September we held a performance with the children at the school assembly. We had a huge and enthusiastic audience of two parents and the children performed their music! They were accompanied by a topical tune (*Reduce, Reuse, Recycle*). Thanks to all the parents and carers who supported this process. Regards, Ali and Julie
