#### **NAPLAN Online**



NAPLAN is an annual assessment for all students in **Years 3**, **5**, **7 and 9**. It tests the types of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. The tests cover skills in reading, writing, spelling, grammar and punctuation, and numeracy.

The assessments are undertaken every year in the second full week in May. This year at Barkers Vale PS, the NAPLAN test will be administered online. In preparation, students will

participate in the NAPLAN Online practice test. Our NAPLAN Online practice test will take place in Week 10 (next week), with current Year 3 and Year 5 students participating. There is no need for students to feel anxious or to do any preparation for this test as the purpose is solely to highlight any possible technical issues. It is a great opportunity for these students to experience the testing environment before participating in the actual NAPLAN test next term.
