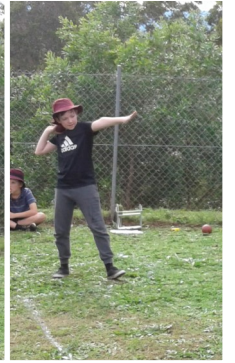


Get to Know You Day at Eltham PS

Last Thursday, Year 5/6 students attending the upcoming Canberra Excursion gathered at Eltham Public School for a 'Get to know you' day. Students were able to ask questions about the upcoming excursion, were led through an itinerary for the week, and were involved in several team building activities. Student behaviour and respect was commendable and many BVPS students have already begun to make some new friends. The Canberra Excursion is now a few weeks away. Due to school fundraising and the PACER (Parliament and Civics Education Rebate), we have managed to reduce the cost of the excursion by \$200, to \$450. This amount is now due.

During the educational tour of the national capital, students will be given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards these costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.

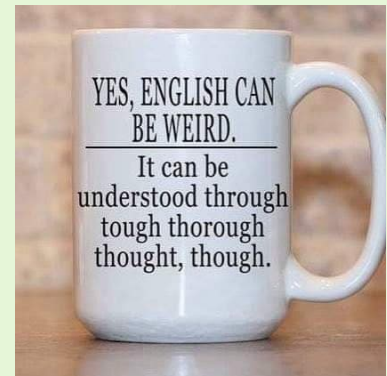

SCHOOL LUNCH BOX IDEAS

Children eat different amounts of food according to their growth patterns. For smaller appetites pack smaller serves – cut sandwiches into quarters and chop up fruit into bite-size pieces.

Snack small can or tub of fruit

Lunch chicken and lettuce rolled up in Lebanese bread, with fruit in season and plain, reduced fat milk in a thermos (to keep it cold)



RECIPE Apricot Drumsticks

Ingredients:

- 4 skinless chicken drumsticks
- ¼ cup apricot nectar
- 1 tablespoon low salt soy sauce
- 2 teaspoons tomato sauce
- 1 teaspoon lemon juice



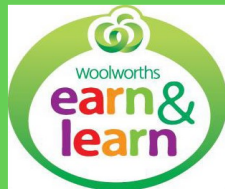
Method:

1. Make a few slashes in each drumstick using a sharp knife.
2. Put drumsticks in an ovenproof dish.
3. Pour over the combined nectar, sauces and lemon juice.
4. Marinate for 30 minutes.
5. Preheat oven to 180 degrees and bake with marinade for 30 minutes turning once.

Can be served hot or packed cold in a school lunchbox with a frozen water bottle.

Shoes: These are compulsory in all events.

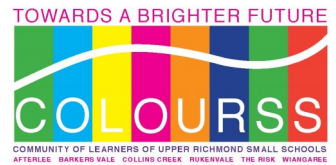
Canteen: A canteen will be operating on the day. Pre-orders for lunch will NOT be taken. There will be some hot food available as well as drinks, cakes etc.
