Life Education Van Visit

The Life Education Van will be visiting Barkers Vale PS <u>next week</u>. Here are the details:

When: Monday, 3rd September.

Where: At school.

Cost: \$5 per child. (The school is covering half the normal cost of \$10).

Who: We would like all children to attend, as the content covered by the Life Education programme is part of the NSW Curriculum that we are required to teach.

The children will be split into three groups for the visit: K/1/2, 3/4 and 5/6. The programmes to be covered are as follows:

K/1/2: Safety Rules: Problem solving, personal safety, seeking help, how to care for others and behaviours that maintain friendships.

3/4: bCyberwise: Explores cyber safety through animation, vox pops (the voice / ideas) of children, relevant scenarios, discussion and problem solving.

5/6: Relate Respect Connect: Teaches the knowledge, skills and attitudes that children need to develop and maintain safe and respectful relationships both on and offline. Including effective communication skills, development of empathy and conflict resolution skills.

NAPLAN ONLINE

From 2019 the NAPLAN test will be administered online. In preparation, all schools will sit a School Readiness Test to ensure equipment and processes work smoothly. Our School Readiness Test will take place in Week 7 (next week), with current Year 3 and Year 5 students participating in this practice test. There is no need for students to feel anxious or to do any preparation for this test as the purpose is solely to highlight any possible technical issues. It is a great opportunity for these students to preview the online test. We will aim to complete this test on Tuesday morning. They should begin building their model by Week 8, ready for the Tuesday Week 10 due date. Speeches are also coming up, and 4/5/6 students have been working on these during class over the past several weeks. They have all made a good start, selecting their preferred topic and brainstorming ideas. They will now need to complete these speeches at home. In-class speeches will be presented on Monday 10th September (Week 8). Selected students will move on to the next round and will be invited to present their speech at Inter-Speak on 20th September.

Attendance Update

A few weeks ago we had a visit from Darryl Davis (Home School Liaison Officer) regarding student attendance. It is important (and an expectation of the Department of Education), that your child attends school regularly. We are pleased to see an improvement of the attendance of several of our students. Thank you.

Similarly, Darryl has been alerted via our online data that the amount of partial absences (students arriving late or leaving early) is concerning. We are committed to improving this. We understand that living out of town, we can't always make appointments out of school hours, but it is hoped we can try whenever possible to minimise disruption to your child's learning needs.

Did you know that when your child arrives late for school they can:-

- Miss out on important social interactions with their peers before class
- Miss out on communication of messages and learning expectations
- Become anxious as they may be unsure of what is happening
- Interrupt and distract other learners



We understand that families are busy and 'things happen', but expect that students will be here on time as much as possible .When this is not possible (as expected by the DET), a reasonable explanation needs to be supplied.

Regular lateness may lead to intervention from Darryl, our Home School Liaison Officer.

- Wash your hands with soap




- Flush the toilets
